project. In order to achieve all the aforementioned objectives, the Cruyff Courts were created, safe play areas that encourage children and young people to play outdoors in order to learn the importance of unity, to make friends, to discover their own talents, and to learn to win and to lose. At the same time, the development of this project aims to make the neighbourhood more dynamic.

The Cruyff Courts allow children to practice all kinds of sports and participate in activities led by Cruyff Foundation coaches, such as the Cruyff Courts 6 vs 6 Tournament.

This initiative also promotes two specific projects on these football pitches: the Cruyff Courts 6vs6, championships for boys and girls aged 10 to 12 in which all the Cruyff Courts take part, and the Community Program, with the participation of the Cruyff Foundation.
